

Alan Baldry Award

Background

The Alan Baldry Award – the Shepherd’s crook – was presented to the Sheep and Beef Cattle Society of the NZVA from the British Sheep Veterinary Society (SVS) at the 2nd International Meeting of Sheep Veterinarians at Massey University, Palmerston North in February 1989. It was presented in memory of Alan Baldry, a distinguished member of the British SVS who died in a tragic car accident while in New Zealand.

The Sheep and Beef Cattle Society of the NZVA decided to award the Crook annually to a member of the Society who has made a significant contribution to the New Zealand Sheep and Beef Cattle industry.

Nominations for the award may be made to the Committee of the Sheep and Beef Cattle Society by 1 May. The Committee will consider the nominations and make a decision before the annual NZVA Conference.

The award is presented at the annual NZVA Conference in June.
